

L'ORÉAL PROFESSIONNEL PURSUES PREVENTION OF MUSCULOSKELETAL DISORDERS AMONG HAIRDRESSERS - LAUNCH OF NEW MOBILE APP -

Paris, November 2nd - Co-developed with the Global Alliance for Musculoskeletal Health NGO, the program "L'Oréal Professionnel with you against MSDs" is designed to help hairdressers reduce the prevalence rate of this crucial workplace problem. By end 2016, 431 000 hairdressers worldwide will have been trained thanks to a 15 minute daily exercise regimen deployed in all the brand's education modules. To further its commitment, L'Oréal Professionnel has launched a new free mobile application, "15' Coach", to help hairdressers prevent MSDs and monitor the impact of the program on their health.

MSDs represent 75% of job related health issues among hairdressers

Hairdressers are particularly exposed to MSDs. Standing for many hours in their salon, repeating gestures and bad postures while shampooing, styling or blow drying can lead to severe back and neck pains and carpal tunnel syndrome affecting hands and wrists. In the US, absenteeism and financial compensation due to MSDs represent 20 billion dollars; in France, the financial impact is estimated at 1 billion euros. MSDs can also lead hairdressers to retire up to 10 years before their planned retirement date.

L'Oréal Professionnel Education training sessions

Free to download on Apple and Android stores, the "15' Coach" app is available in English, French, German, Spanish, Portuguese, Russian, Chinese and Brazilian. The program starts with a series of questions to assess the level of pain in several key parts of the body: neck, wrists, knees, etc. Users are asked to fill in this section regularly to measure the impact of the program on their health by an independent organization. The workout sessions feature a 5 minute warm-up to prepare muscles at the start of the day, 5 minutes to learn the proper postures and 5 minutes of stretching at the end of the day.
